Igwe has bravely worked to end human rights violations. He sustained beatings and arrests to combat the persecution, maiming and killing of African children and women falsely accused of witchcraft.

His activism extends to oppose other abuses including anti-gay hate, sorcery, ritual killing, human sacrifice, “untouchability,” caste discrimination, “child witch” superstition, and anti-blasphemy laws.

Mr. Igwe is the founder of the Nigerian Humanist Movement and the Nigerian Skeptics Society. He was the Western and Southern African representative to the International Humanist and Ethical Union (IHEU). Currently he is enrolled in a three-year research program on “Witchcraft Accusations in Africa” at the University of Bayreuth, in Germany.
